### **Week #1**

**June 7-11**

#### **How Big is the Universe? led by Carol Ackerman**

Learn about astronomy and craft a model of our solar system. Improve your computer skills while you expand your knowledge of the Milky Way.

### **Week #2**

**June 14-18**

#### **Let it Fly led by Mary Anne Mathwich**

Explore the science behind FLIGHT with a kite demonstration, a radio- controlled plane demonstration, by building and flying kites, and by creating things that fly such as planes, “fish”, bug bubbles and rockets powered by bubbles.
